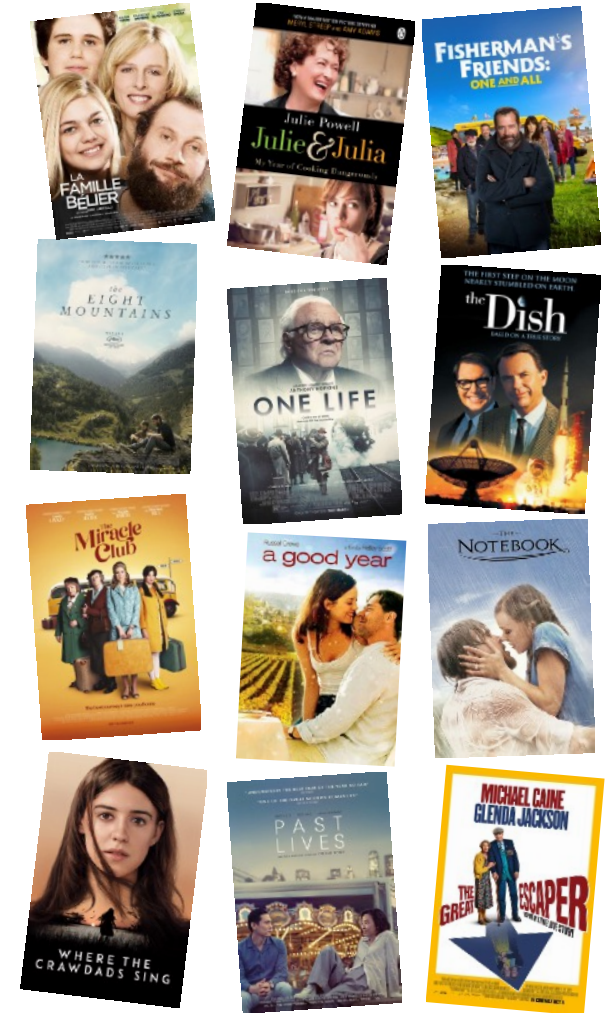

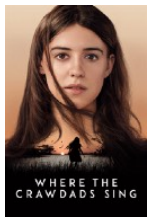
Julie and Julia

Showcases the life of Nicholas Winton (Anthony Hopkins), who helped evacuate over six hundred children from Nazi-occupied Czechoslovakia. Fifty years later he is still haunted by his past. A moving film.

A British investment broker (Russell Crowe) inherits his uncle's chateau and vineyard in Provence, where he had spent much of his childhood. He discovers a new laid-back lifestyle as he tries to renovate the estate to be sold.
